TEACHER'S PLAYBOOK – ENCOURAGING RESPONSIBILITY IN STUDENTS

Why acknowledgement is important?

- **Praise their effort:** Celebrate the process of their learning and efforts rather than only the outcomes. This builds a sense of ownership and responsibility in them.
- **Foster Independence:** Give freedom to complete tasks on their own, but set clear guidelines for behavior and academic tasks and keep track of their actions.
- **Provide Responsibility:** Teach students the value of contributing. Give them tasks according to age, like pet care and household chores. Also, acknowledge their effort.

THE ART OF ARTICLES

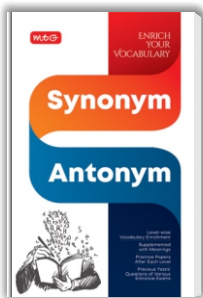
Articles in English grammar are essential words that help define nouns as specific or general. There are three types of articles: "a", "an", and "the". The usage of these articles can sometimes be tricky, but understanding when and how to use them properly is key to mastering English.

1. **A** dog barked loudly outside the house.
"A" is used because we are referring to any dog, not a specific one.
2. **An** apple a day keeps the doctor away.
"An" is used before words that begin with a vowel sound (in this case, "apple").
3. **The** sun sets in the west.
"The" is used because we are referring to a specific, unique thing—there is only one sun.
4. I went to **the** store yesterday.
"The" is used here because it refers to a specific store that both the speaker and listener are familiar with.
5. **A** teacher is a guide for students.
"A" is used because we are referring to any teacher in general.

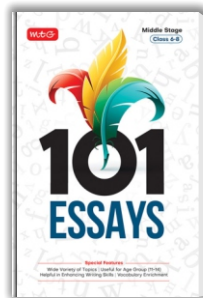
